Tena koutou katoa,



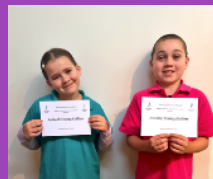
