This day was for the Top of the South Iwi, Te Kahui Mātauranga o Te Taihū o te waka a Māui, to present their education framework. This was great learning and we came away with a lot to consider and plan for in our own school curriculum and the delivery of learning in 2023.

We welcomed two international families from Germany and Switzerland to our school whanau last week and it is so good once again to have our global friends being able to learn and live with us at our school. We also welcomed Jessica Helke from Germany as a teaching intern for Nile Rua class.

Jessica will be with us for Term 4 and Term 1 next year. We love having this connection to the world now the borders are open and we can share in many experiences together.


Attached is the last Principal's Challenge for the year.
