Making bikes available for everyone

On the lookout for a second-hand bike? You should check out Bike Hub Nelson. 'The Hub' is a not-for-profit, volunteer-powered scheme that repairs bikes donated by the public and the Police and makes them available to the community on a koha-basis.

With over 40 active volunteers on board, Bike Hub Nelson is removing the financial obstacles to bike ownership in our region, and has re-homed over 1500 bikes since its launch in May last year.

You'll find their workshop near the Saxton Field hockey facilities and they're open to the public on Mondays from 5.30pm to 7pm and Wednesdays from 2.30pm to 4.30pm.

Tēnā koutou katoa.

We have made a great start to term 4. Our tamariki returned with lots of stories to tell and were really happy to be back at school with their

friends. The learning began for the Nile Classes in week 1 with trips to the Suter Gallery to explore the stories and craft behind Tau Moko and this week a trip to the Museum to explore the Te Ara o Hine Rehia- a journey into the world of kapa haka.

These experiences arow our children's knowledge and understanding of the meanings behind these traditional forms of the Maori arts and they enjoyed being immersed in both of these experiences. We are so fortunate to be able to access the education programmes for both of these amazing places that are on our doorstep. The children may like to return to the Museum which has free entry for locals to have another look and spend more time there. The Suter has free entry on a Saturday for locals and this is well worth a visit.
